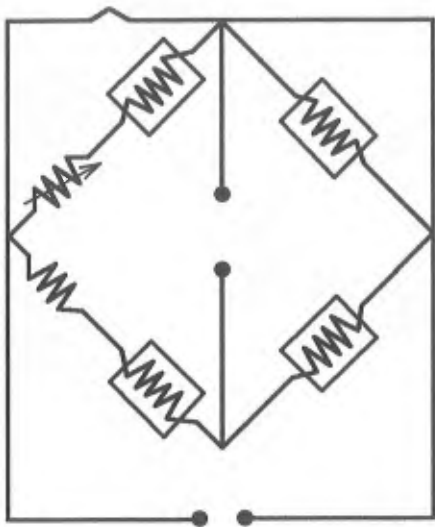


STATUES

If you are a statue, the object of the game is not to be heard and to move without being caught. More about Kate Greenstreet at www.kickingwind.com.

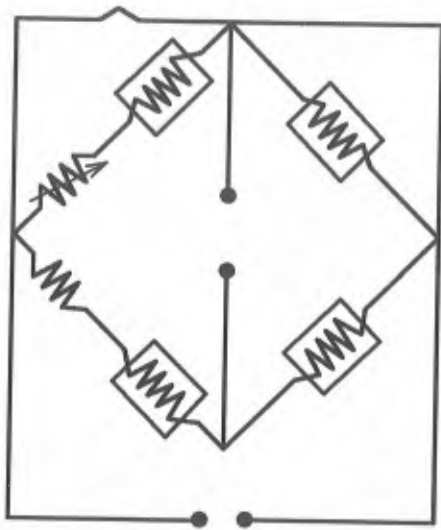
